



CREATE GROWTH UPDATE

DECEMBER 2022

Welcome to the first update of the East Midlands Create Growth programme. The programme team have been working hard in the set-up phase and we anticipate more visible engagement in early 2023 focussed around two main activities:

- Innovate UK funding competition
- Applications to join the first cohort of businesses

Both are available to Creative Businesses based in Leicestershire, Derbyshire, Rutland and Lincolnshire. **You are welcome to apply to either or both.**

Innovate UK Create Growth Funding competition

Innovate UK will invest approximately £3m across six regions, including the East Midlands counties included in Create Growth. Grants of between £10,000 and £30,000 will be made for innovation projects to grow business.

To support applications, EMC² will be hosting an online workshop led by a previously successful Innovate UK funding applicant to offer advice and guidance.

The date is to be confirmed but we are aiming for mid-January, which will allow a few weeks to polish your application before the February 8 deadline.



EMC² business support programme

The business support programme will be a combination of masterclass workshops and intense mentoring, with the end goal of putting your business in a stronger position to receive investment. The first cohort will be those already on the path to investment readiness.

The programme will run until 2025 with at least three more cohorts, other opportunities to get support and a programme of local events.

Eligibility

Eligible geographies for the EMC² for Create Growth are:

- Derbyshire
- Leicestershire
- Lincolnshire
- Rutland

This includes all local authority areas within these boundaries, for example, Derby and Leicester cities and North and North East Lincolnshire.

Eligible sectors:

The creative industries are defined by the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS). Your project should focus on one or more of the following sub-sectors:

- advertising and marketing
- architecture
- crafts
- design and designer fashion
- film
- television
- video
- radio
- photography
- IT, gaming, software and computer services
- publishing
- museums, galleries and libraries
- music, performing and visual art

Creative industry businesses refer to those with a high intensity of creative occupations. You can refer to the [DCMS Economic Estimates](#) for a list of the sub-sectors and their associated SIC codes, that DCMS classifies under the creative industries.
